You will need to make effective use of research to make the best decision regarding your post-16 pathway choices. For this, you will need to employ your skills of resourcefulness. You will also need to work with school and college staff in order to gain the right information and guidance to make those steps onto the next stage of your career. Last Friday, September 16<sup>th</sup> the schedule of career appointments began and what a fantastic start to them! Every student knew exactly what they wanted to do when they leave and what course they wanted to take and where. This is fantastic work. A-Levels in Art Maths and English, vocational courses in Vehicle Maintenance and Carpentry were the pathways decided on.
